Practical Conservation Trainee - Somerset, North

Based at:

Somerset Wildlife Trust, Callow Rock Offices, Shipham Road, Cheddar, BS27 3DQ

Type of work the role will be involved with:

This placement is based at Callow Rock near Cheddar. The trainee will have an opportunity to learn at sites across the Mendip Hills North Somerset. This is a primarily practical habitat management role. The trainee will be involved in leading volunteer groups and in development and implementation of site management plans. The trainee will learn about:

- Scrub clearance, tree felling, coppicing and hedge-laying
- Drystone walling, fencing and reserve infrastructure work
- Surveying and monitoring
- Working with and leading volunteers from a wide range of backgrounds
- Giving guidance and advice to the visiting public
- Occasional community group engagement including school visits, guided walks and events
- Media and communication skills e.g., writing blogs or providing posts for the Somerset Wildlife Trust facebook page

All trainees will receive training in key skills such as time management, personal effectiveness, interview and application techniques.
