





JOB DESCRIPTION: Avalon Marshes Engagement Officer

Somerset Wildlife Trust is a local independent charity focused on improving the natural environment of Somerset for the benefit of wildlife and people. We champion Somerset's stunning, diverse, and important natural environment, making the case for nature to the public and politicians. We protect wildlife and lead the recovery of the environment by example, including on our nature reserves.

Somerset Wildlife Trust is one of 46 Wildlife Trusts across Britain which together with the *Royal Society of Wildlife Trusts* collectively form *The Wildlife Trusts*. We are the biggest charity movement in the UK working solely for nature and we believe that restoring nature on a landscape scale is essential for tackling climate change and biodiversity loss.

Our Vision

To deliver a Somerset wide nature recovery network creating more space for wildlife, benefiting everyone, and playing its part in helping us reverse biodiversity loss and tackle the climate crisis.

Our Mission

To champion the change needed to rebalance our relationship with wildlife and the natural world.

Our Goals for 2030:

- 1. To ensure that nature is improving across the county, supported by restored natural processes, and is connected and protected through a Nature Recovery Network, with at least 30% of land and sea managed positively for nature.
- 2. For nature to be valued and protected by everyone, building a movement with at least 1 in 4 people taking action for nature's recovery across Somerset.
- 3. By 2030 to tell the story of nature's recovery in Somerset through a shared, live online State of Nature tool that monitors progress and informs action.

Working in partnership with the RSPB, the Trust has been successful in securing Green Recovery Challenge Funding for the Avalon Marshes Wetland Wonderland.

The Avalon Marshes is one of the largest & most important wetland areas in the UK, home to a range of wildfowl, waders, rare insects, plants & reptiles & threatened native species. This vital landscape is at risk from fluctuating water levels, agrienvironment transition & habitat fragmentation. Covid-19 has resulted in habitat management delays, as well as seeing a huge increase in visitor numbers which our current infrastructure cannot accommodate.

At the heart of this landscape is the Avalon Marshes Landscape Partnership, consisting of Natural England, the RSPB, Hawk and Owl Trust, Somerset Wildlife Trust, South West Heritage Trust and the Environment Agency. Together the partnership are working towards a joint vision by which communities, landowners and businesses work together to manage the land

to achieve a thriving, nature-rich wetland landscape which is resilient and able to adapt to climate change, and providing significant income to the local and county economies through regenerative agriculture and eco-tourism.

Our project will further enable this vison by:

- Direct delivery on three existing sites, Somerset Wildlife Trust's Westhay Moor National Nature Reserve (NNR) and Honeygar Farm (a former dairy unit) and RSPB's Ham Wall NNR. Across these sites we will work to improve water quality, enhance passage for eels & fish, create a new hide and island habitats at Westhay, and begin restoration of Honeygar. This will help us to create bigger, better & more joined up habitats.
- Reaching out to new audiences, developing our offer and encouraging visitors from local urban areas & removing
 physical barriers with virtual engagement tools, as well as increased and improved signage, guidance, trails, &
 events.
- Co-ordinate a consultant led Community Renewal Funded Project producing an Avalon Marshes (AM) Feasibility Study and Roadmap: a detailed feasibility study and options appraisal of tourism needs in the Avalon Marshes to create a 'masterplan' for future development of the visitor economy, balancing growth with environmental sustainability.

Job Purpose	This is a new post, part of a new team, created for the Green Recovery Challe Fund supported Avalon Marshes Wetland Wonderland project. The post is he Somerset Wildlife Trust on behalf of the project partnership.	
	This post will work with existing Avalon Marshes staff and the new team to expand & develop immersive engagement experiences that connect people with the landscape and inspire them to take action.	
	The post will focus on enabling local communities to learn about and appreciate the natural landscape of the Avalon Marshes and will design and deliver supporter journeys for new and regular visitors to the reserves and online, focusing on removing barriers to a connection with nature.	
	Through developing and delivering an outreach programme for urban audiences, with a particular focus on families, in Bridgwater, Glastonbury, Highbridge and surrounding areas, the postholder will engage new groups with the Avalon Marshes and support them to understand and orientate themselves in the reserves when visiting through tours, self-guided walks and events. The postholder will support visitors to enjoy and appreciate the wellbeing benefits nature brings.	

	This is a challenging role working with multiple groups, partners and stakeholders. The postholder will need excellent communication, networking and engagement skills, and a passion to achieve more for nature. This is a fixed term appointment until March 2023.

Job Description

Key responsibilities

Working with the Avalon Marshes partners and project team to complement existing delivery this post will:

- Develop and deliver an engaging and inspiring programme of activities that works with the five pathways to nature connection for the general public, families and local communities on our Avalon Marshes nature reserves, including Westhay Moor, Catcott and Honeygar Farm
- Run an outreach programme in local communities, including Glastonbury, Bridgwater and Highbridge and Burnham-on-Sea to support nature connection and a sense of value in their local wildlife, encouraging them to access our reserves and to take personal action to support nature's recovery
- Work with local schools to enable them to access our sites, learn about the wildlife on their doorstep and connect with nature
- Work with groups experiencing reduced wellbeing to help them connect with nature for the benefits it brings
- Examine barriers to engagement and access and work to remove them so that our sites are as inclusive and welcoming as possible
- Develop printed and online content to support engagement both on site and virtually
- Work with partners and the Avalon Marshes team to develop supporter journeys for new and existing audiences to engage them with, help them understand, value and take action to protect nature
- With Somerset Environmental Records Centre and Avalon Marshes partners develop and deliver citizen science initiatives to engage communities with nature in the Avalon Marshes
- Develop and deliver an impact monitoring programme to evaluate outcomes and success
- Recruit, train and support volunteers to assist you in delivery and to act as champions within their own communities, encouraging others to take action for nature

- Provide support to the Avalon Marshes Communication Officer to develop online engagement tools
- Provide support to Reserves Officers to identify opportunities for volunteering that contribute to nature recovery objectives
- Work with the Engagement Team and Communications Team to ensure work fits our strategic direction and is communicated internally and externally, celebrating the Avalon Marshes, our sites and the work we are doing.
