## Technical responsibilities (key tasks)

- Bats: assist with preliminary bat and bird assessments, bat roost and activity surveys, undertake infrared footage review, sonogram analysis and help to prepare reports.
- Other protected species (badger, beaver, bird, great crested newt, hazel dormouse, reptile, water vole and otter): assist with preliminary assessments, undertake presence or likely absence surveys, inform mitigation compensation and enhancement strategies and help prepare reports.
- Other habitats: assist with the categorisation of habitats and complete higher level and project specific botanical surveys.

## General responsibilities

- Administration: use the systems in place to allow cohesive and efficient team working (e.g. time and financial recording systems).
- Policies: comply with all policies and procedures of First Ecology (e.g. health and safety).
- Values: uphold the working values and expectations of First Ecology.
- Other: carry out other duties relevant to the post as reasonably required.
